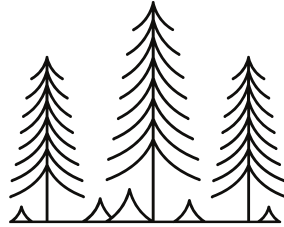


Shelter Skelter

This activity will give participants a new perspective on what it takes for different animals to survive in the wild. Relate this activity to natural habitats or shelter for wildlife.



Forest Forts

Build different sized teepees or a lean to. Take into consideration if it will shield the wind, survive a storm, keep you dry, and camouflage into your surroundings. Decide ahead of time what animal this shelter is for. Make sure the residents will have the space and surroundings they need to thrive.

Best Nest

Set boundaries and make different sized bird nests in the forest using only natural materials in that area. But wait, that's not the only catch, birds don't actually have hands to build with. These feathered friends use their beaks to do most of the heavy lifting and craftsmanship. Time to get into character and try to build these nests without using your hands!

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
